Clive's Comments Continued...

Granted these vests are great for people working on road sides and in areas of low visibility where vehicles are moving at rapid rates. However when at a loading dock for a supermarket or garden centre, I fail to see their point. Setting up at a show also requires a high vis vest so that we can stand out against all the other brightly coloured signs, displays and people moving around very slow cars. These cars must have their hazard lights on so that the pedestrians can see them. Again hazard lights are good in areas of low light or where other vehicles are moving but what is the point in a crowded festival? It is far more likely the people will see the vehicles long before they notice any flashing lights.

Safety Boots are another favourite. These are great for work sites, factories and construction areas where people are likely to drop things on their feet but why are they required when picking up parcels at a freight depot or dropping off plants at a landscape site? Also at construction sites there is a reason for tagging power leads but I can't see the point in tagging a lead in an office or small kitchen. If tagging small appliances and the like was so important why can they be sold 'untagged'. I was recently doing a cooking demonstration at a large corporation store and was told my hot plate couldn't be used as it wasn't tagged. I said I will use one of theirs from the home and garden department but these weren't tagged either. Safe to sell but not use.

Yesterday the Coroner released a report recommending suicide prevention fences be worked into the designs of all new commercial, industrial and public buildings as the result of a suicide from a public carpark. No-one wants to see people take their own life but putting up fences around the upper levels of all buildings is not going to stop them. First these fences will need to be on all new buildings and retrofitted to all old buildings – who pays? Second (I am not an expert in this field) I don't think suicide is an impulse thing. If we block off the buildings they will just go to another place. Suicide prevention is done through community involvement and understanding what people are struggling with.

These are only a few examples of the 'rules and regulations' that are used to stop us being human. When I see a young child with a grazed knee I see someone who is experiencing life. I do not see a need for another rule to stop it happening again. We are human, we will hurt ourselves and we will learn from our mistakes.

Finally, my old mate Charles Darwin has a theory about this and sometimes stupid people will die from doing stupid things. Accidents will happen. For example if we were really concerned about road trauma we would set the speed limits at 15kmh in the city and 20kmh on the open road. We would make all drivers and passengers use racing harness and wear crash helmets. Of course road travel would become slow and almost useless but injuries would be minimal.

There must be a point where we have to accept the cost of preventing the accident is higher than the benefit. The bureaucrats make these suggestions that then become rules without any real analysis. As a small business I am obligated under legislation to constantly review the risks associated with my work place and decide if they can be reduced in a safe and efficient manner. Isn't it about time the lawyers, risk managers, insurers and public service did the same? For example, I would like to see how many people were hit by moving vehicles at show set ups in 2015 (with all the lights and vests in use) and how many were hit in 1990 when we didn't enforce their usage.

Before any new 'safety' rules are implemented there should be an analysis of the risk of trauma prior to the rule and the risk of trauma after. This review should also look at the long term implications on the community and take into account that people must be accountable for their actions. It is not up to the state to legislate to prevent every possible accident.

I love the old phrase: "education not legislation". Maybe before I leave this planet someone, somewhere in government will actually be brave enough to stand up and say 'stop', enough rules!
