Clive's Comments

Australia went to the polls last month and Labour won well. Not who I wanted but at least they are governing in their own right and don't need to deal with minor parties. Often a result of our voting system. The whole concept of preferences seems to really confuse Australians. I have lived in a few countries and of these we are the only one with compulsory voting and preferential voting. After every election these issues are debated. Next is preferential voting. Australians just cannot get their heads around the concept. First they seem to think that if party x gives party y their preference in the lower house then that is what happens. They do not realise that they decide the preference by how they fill out the ballot...

...They also do not understand that in most electorates all that matters is which of the two main parties is highest on the ballot paper. There maybe ten candidates and they put Liberal nine and Labour ten then their vote is for Liberal. If they miss number the ballot then it is void.

So the request is for 'first past the post' ballots. This means that you only put a tick against the candidate you want. The person with the highest number wins. Sounds good and is fine for four or less candidates. However if there is ten then the winner may only have 11% of the votes. This means 89% don't want that person but 11% do. Not really representative of what the electors want.

Another option is Optional Preferential. This is where you can vote for one candidate or vote for one and then give preferences. You can place a vote for all or just a few candidates and it counts. Probably the best balance of democratic and practical ways to vote. It means the voter can indicate a preference for whom they would like if their preferred candidate is knocked out or that they don't care.

The final option which is the most democratic but the hardest to explain and toughest to count is Optional Proportional Preferential voting. This is where the voter can indicate that they have a preference or don't care if their preferred candidates are knocked out. The difference is that if there are four candidates then the second preference is only worth 0.75 of a vote, the second is worth 0.50 and the third is worth 0.25. If there are ten candidates then second is worth 0.9 and so-on. Very hard to explain and even harder to manage.

Whichever system used the result is still the same. We vote based on the party's policies.

Occasionally people vote for the individual candidate but normally it is not the case. Then the problem occurs in that you can only vote for this party or that party. Each party may have some policies that a voter likes but they can only pick one.

Occasionally a voter maybe in an electorate where a minor party or an independent party is strong enough to be a challenge or even win. They may have policies the voter likes but as an independent or minor party they are unlikely to be able to push policies through parliament.

Some people have always voted Labour and some always voted Liberal or another party. They will never change. Some swing from election to election and others vote on a single issue. For many voters each party has a range of issues the voter likes so it comes down to a balance of for and against. These are often the swing voters who actually determine the result of the election

None of these voting options are ideal but I just cannot come up with a perfect system. The only truism is that if you don't vote you have no right to criticise the government. We should all be glad that we actually have the opportunity to vote and that the elections are open and not rigged or controlled by guns. Many people do not have this privilege.

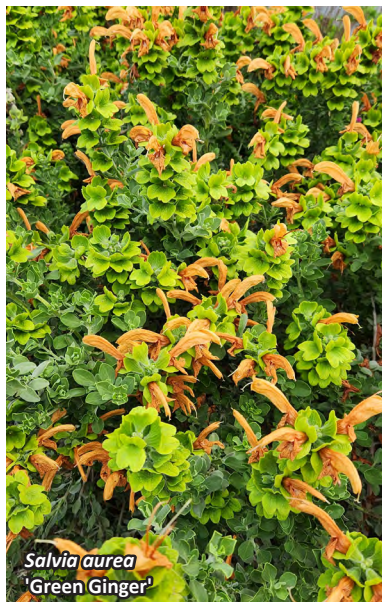

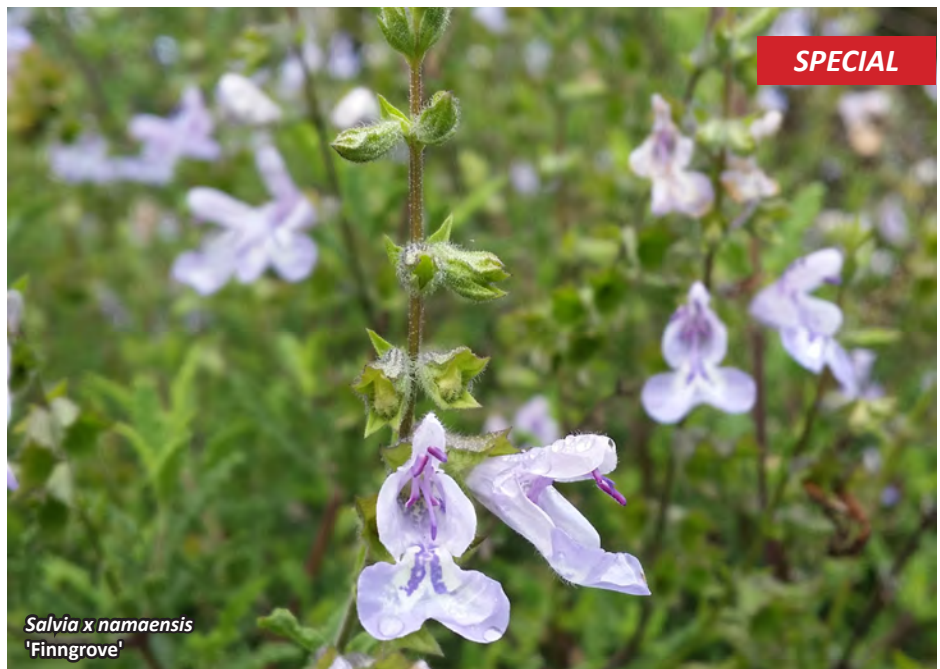
